
Mihrab

A **mihrab** (Arabic: محاريب) is a niche in the wall of a mosque that indicates the *qibla*, that is, the direction of Kaaba that Muslims should face when praying. The wall in which a *mihrab* appears is thus the "*qibla* wall."

Mihrabs should not be confused with the minbar, which is the pulpit from which an Imam (leader of prayer) addresses the congregation.

History [edit]



The word *mihrab* originally had a non-religious meaning and simply denoted a special room in a house, a throne room in a palace for example. The Fath al-Bari (p. 458), on the authority of others, suggests the *mihrab* is "the most honorable location of kings" and "the master of locations, the front and the most honorable." The *Mosques in Islam* (p. 213), in addition to Arabic sources, cites Theodor Nöldeke and others as having considered a *mihrab* to have originally signified a throne room.

The term was subsequently used by the Prophet

Muhammad to denote his own private prayer
room. The room additionally provided access to

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







Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu

The Church of Saint Peter in Gallicantu was built in 1931 on the eastern slopes of Mount Zion to commemorate Peter's triple rejection of Jesus and his subsequent remorse. Beneath the church are a series of carved-out chambers from the Second Temple period. Since Catholic tradition positions the palace of Caiaphas on this very site, it is believed that Jesus may have been imprisoned in one of these underground crypts.

A Byzantine shrine dedicated to Peter's repentance was erected on this spot in the middle of the fifth century and was later destroyed by Muslim invaders. The chapel was rebuilt by the Crusaders and given a new name: St. Peter's in Gallicantu, Galli-cantu means cock-crow in Latin and today a golden rooster protrudes prominently from the sanctuary roof.



Church of All Nations (Jerusalem)

The Church of All Nations, also known as the Church of the Agony or the Basilica of the Agony, is a Roman Catholic church located on Mount of Olives in Jerusalem, next to the Garden of Gethsemane. It enshrines a section of bedrock where Jesus is said to have prayed before the night of his arrest.

The chapel was built from 1919 to 1924 using funds from many different countries (hence the title). The symbols of each country are incorporated into the glass of the ceiling, each in a separate, small dome. The front of the church is a facade supported by a row of pillars. Above is a modern mosaic depicting Jesus Christ symbolically as the link between God and humanity. The bubbled-dome roof, thick pillars, and mosaic give the church a Byzantine look architecturally. The architect of the building was Antonio Barluzzi.

The current church rests on the foundations of two earlier ones - a 12th century Crusader chapel abandoned in 1345 and a 4th century Byzantine basilica, destroyed by an earthquake in 746.

The church is currently operated by the Franciscans; an open altar in the garden is used by the Anglican community on Holy Thursday.
