

Paul's letter to believers in Rome

Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? Just as it is written, "FOR YOUR SAKE WE ARE BEING PUT TO DEATH ALL DAY LONG; WE WERE CONSIDERED AS SHEEP TO BE SLAUGHTERED."

But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.



"The great difficulty with many Christians is that cannot persuade themselves that Christ (or God) loves them; and the reason why they cannot feel confident of the love of God, is, that they know they do not deserve His love, on the contrary, that they are in the highest degree unlovely. How can the infinitely pure God love those who are defiled with sin, who are proud, selfish, discontented, ungrateful, disobedient? This indeed is hard to believe. But it is the very thing we are required to believe"

Parallelism	the practice of balancing one thought or phrase by a corresponding thought or phrase
Synonymous Parallelism	Identical or similar ideas *Psa 24:1; <u>19.2</u>
Antithetic Parallelism	Opposing or contrasting ideas *Psa 1:6
Constructive Parallelism	Expanding similar ideas *Psa 2:6; <u>Prov 26:4</u>
Climatic Parallelism	Incomplete ideas that build up *Psa 29:1
Emblematic Parallelism	Ideas followed by vivid pictures *Prov 11:22


